Promote your geoscientific degree programmes via GUIDE

The new **G**eoscience **U**niversity **D**egree (GUIDE-) portal (**www.geoscience-studies.org**) is designed to offer (prospective) students a general overview of the manifold possibilities regarding university education in geoscience.

GUIDE provides a rating-free overview of the curricula of available geoscientific university study programs in Europe. The portal was created to include all university courses (undergraduate/BSc and graduate/MSc) with their unique teaching profiles. GUIDE will:

- Provide orientation for prospective as well as undergraduate students
- Foster student mobility in Europe and beyond
- Strengthen collaboration within Europe by enabling the full utilisation of possibilities within the European university degree system
- Strengthen comparability and transparency between geoscientific university degrees
- Fasten individual academic studies and reduce drop-out rates
- Provide information for employers regarding the expected qualifications of potential applicants

The official roll-out of the portal is planned for June 2020.

Why should my university be present in GUIDE?

Our interaction with students over the last years has shown that most - but in particular BSc - students are not aware of the extensive options for geoscience university education on an international and even on a national level. By participating in GUIDE, your university gets the chance to:

- Make students aware of the available geosciences' programmes at your university
- Attract international students to your university
- Show the strengths and focus areas of your geoscience programmes
- Create an alternative to distorted ranking systems
- Reduce your drop-out rate by allowing an informed choice of the study programme

The portal is based on a quantification of the curriculum using the European credit point system in combination with a standardised categorisation scheme. In order to guarantee the correctness of the data, each university can include and later modify their data individually via a simple interface.
